Forced or compulsory labour is all work or service which is exacted from any person under the threat of a penalty and for which the person has not offered himself or herself voluntarily.

International Labour Organization Forced Labour Convention, 1930 (No. 29)

“For 6 years, I needed to work from 4 am to 1 am every day without any day off. I was not allowed to go out by myself and had no means to contact others. The only communication that I had with my family back in Indonesia was when my mother called my employer’s mobile phone and I was only allowed to talk for 30 minutes once per month. I needed to sleep on the floor without mattress and pillow as my employer alleged that I had made many mistake when I was working. Furthermore, I only received salary HK\$2000 per month although my contractual wage was HK\$4520. My employer told me that she would report me to police if I leave my employment. My employer held my passport and she told me that she would throw away my passport so I wouldn’t be able to go back to Indonesia.”



Victim identification is conducted by IOM (International Organization for Migration) based on the international standards for identification of victims of human trafficking

The statistics include 99 victims of human trafficking who might have been trafficked outside of Hong Kong from period August 2017 – June 2020.
